Message from the Executive Director



Dear Readers,

It's with great pleasure that I share with you the 2020 CoSAP annual report. The year was the most challenging time at individual, organization, country and global levels. COVID-19 affected all of us and disrupted the normal operations. Besides the challenges, our organization accomplished activities that were planned before the emergence of COVID-19 and others planned due to the crisis including capacitating member organizations so that they support SHG members to continue with their functions, CLAs to strengthen efforts even at this crisis time, and federations to actively engage in COVID-19 awareness raising campaigns and mobilize resources to support the needy.

CoSAP through its member organizations has continued reaching over 246,000 women that are organized in 13,339 SHGs. Currently these SHG women have over 245 million Birr (USD 8.2 million) capital. In this year most of the SHG members' business declined due to COVID-19; however, thanks to the social support system that existed for years in SHGs, they remained resilient and are coping with the challenges. Furthermore, in the past year, CoSAP together with other stakeholders proceeded with finding legal options for the SHG approach in the Oromia region.

Finally, I would like to express my thanks to the board of directors of CoSAP for their commitment and guidance in the challengefull year. I also want to thank my small but dedicated team at the secretariat office. CoSAP member organizations' commitment and continuous efforts they put into the SHG work need special appreciation. Most importantly, the courageous SHG women that are striving to change not only their individual lives but also the situation of their community worth much respect. Last but not least my deepest gratitude should go to our funding partners. Without them much of the work that we do will not be possible.

As you go through the report it is my wish that you get good insights of the SHG approach as promoted by CoSAP and its member organizations in 2020.

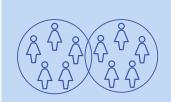
